

The company prepared for inspection, the Inspector will now move along the rank(s). Each man to be inspected, when the instructor stands before him will:

- Quickly raise the piece with THE RIGHT HAND before the body, lock plate to the front, and grasp the piece WITH THE LEFT HAND between the guide sight and lower band<sup>6</sup>.
- The stock should rest against the left forearm; the left hand should be at the height of the chin, the piece opposite the left eye, and vertical.
