

## UNIFORM, &c.

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MAJOR GENERAL.—*Coat*—dark blue cloth, stand-up collar, not higher than the chin, with an embroidered leaf of live oak, and a star on each side; double breasted, one row of buttons on each side, ten in each row, in clusters of three, and one at the top, the rows to be five inches apart at top, and three at the bottom; slash sleeves, four small buttons; pointed cross flaps to the skirts, with four buttons, two in the centre, and one at each end of the flaps, the skirt to reach within three inches of the bend of the knee, with turn backs of cloth, the bottom of the skirt not less than four nor more than five inches broad, with a gold embroidered star on the tail of each skirt, two inches in diameter; two hip buttons to range with the lower buttons on the breast; lining with black silk; two buttons on the fold of each skirt, and one at the tail of each skirt.

*Trousers*—dark blue cloth, with one stripe of buff cloth, one inch wide, up each outward seam, welted at the edges; plain white linen for summer.

*Vest*—for winter, buff, double breasted, with small uniform buttons; white for summer.

*Epaulettes*—gold, with solid crescent; a star one inch and a half in diameter in the crescent; dead and bright gold bullion.

*Buttons*—according to pattern.

*Hat*—cocked, without binding; fan or back part not more than ten nor less than eight inches wide; the front, or cock, not more than eight, nor less than five inches; each corner five inches; black ribbons on the two front sides.

## UNIFORM OF THE ARMY.

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### *Uniform, or Dress of the Army.*

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*Loop and cockade*—cockade of black silk: loop gold six inches long.

*Stock*—black satin or patent leather.

*Boots*—leg.

*Spurs*—Gilt.

*Sword and Scabbard*—according to pattern.

*Sword-knot*—gold braid with bullion hangers.

*Gloves*—black for winter, white for summer.

*Sword-belt*—black patent leather; carriages of the same material, the *belt* to be worn over the coat.

*Plate*—gilt, having a star and a sprig of live oak on each side in gold.

*Sash*—yellow silk net, with fringe ends to go twice round the waist and tie on the right hip.

FOR BRIGADIER GENERAL.—*Coat*—same as for Major General, except the buttons to be ranged in clusters of two on the breast.

*Trousers*—same as for Major General.

*Vest*—do. do do.

*Sash*—red; all other equipments same as for Major General.

## UNDRESS.

*Coat*—citizens', with rolling collar, two rows of buttons arranged as on the uniform coat, four on the flaps, one at each hip, and one on each skirt.

*Frock Coat*—dark blue cloth, double breasted, two rows of buttons placed according to rank, as on the dress coat; stand-up collar; lining black silk: pockets in the folds of the skirts, with one button at the hip, two in each fold, and one at the end of each pocket.

*Trousers*—same as full dress.

*Cloak*—blue cloth, lined with scarlet marino.

## *Uniform of Officers of the General Staff.*

*Coat*—corresponding with that of general officers, without the star on the skirt, and with the buttons at equal distances, ten in each row.

*Trousers*—same as for general officer.

*Vest*—do do do

## UNIFORM OF THE ARMY.

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### *Uniform, or Dress of the Army.*

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*Epaulettes*—same as for general officer without the star.

*Sash*—yellow silk net, to go twice round the waist and tie on the right hip.

*Hat Loop and Cockade*

*Sword and Scabbard*

*Belt and Plate*

*Sword-knot*

*Stock*

*Boots*

*Gloves*

*Cloak*

} The same as for general officers.

*Aguillette*—twisted gold cord, with gilt engraved tags.

### UNDRESS.

*Coat*—as described for general officers, except the buttons at equal distances.

*Frock Coat*—same as for general officers, except the buttons, which will be at equal distances.

*Trousers*—same as for general officers.

### Pay Department.

*Coat*—dark blue cloth, double breasted; standing collar; two rows of buttons ten in each row at equal distances apart, to commence at the collar, and run in a right line to the bottom of the lappel; four inches apart at top, and two and a half at the bottom; skirts to be made after the style of the citizen's coat, with a button at each hip, and at the end of each fold, and one intermediate in each fold; buttons the same as for other officers of the general staff.

*Trousers*—same color as coat, but without ornament.

*Hat*—plain, of the same form and dimensions as described for general officers; black leather, black silk gilt loop, no tassel or other ornament except the cockade and star.

*Sword*—according to pattern.

*Stock*—black satin or patent leather.

*Sword-knot*

*Belt and Plate*
